REHOBOTH CHILDREN'S HOME, INC. (RCHI)

Rehoboth Children's Home, Inc. (RCHI) is a non-stock, non-profit, non-government corporation which is duly registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). It is also registered, licensed, and accredited by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and the Local Government Unit (LGU).

It has been consistent with its articles of incorporation and by-laws. RCHI operates both a residential child-care institution providing basic social intervention to its beneficiaries and a community-based educational assistance program (REAP).

RCHI started its operation in 1981 and continues to provide residential care to children classified as orphaned, abandoned, neglected, and other children at risk in the community. REAP offers educational assistance to local families who are unable to send their children to school or college for financial reasons.

A dynamic and sustainable Christian institution providing holistic services for the economic, social and spiritual development of Filipino children and families.

To promote the wholesome development of Filipino disadvantaged children, youth and families by providing appropriate services to become responsible and productive citizens.

HEALTH & DIETARY SERVICES
